

British Jobs for British Workers? Don't be fooled by BNP Lies

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Nick Griffin, raised on a Suffolk farm with a six-figure inheritance and a Cambridge education, has called people who live on housing estates "scum." He's paid £75,000 (plus expenses) as an MEP, but still claims to defend the interests of ordinary people. Why then, when his constituency includes 38,000 textile workers, does his party have its T-shirts produced in sweatshops in Honduras?

At September's TUC conference in Liverpool, hundreds of local people held a rally against low pay and privatisation. The Merseyside branch of the BNP showed their true colours, opposing the march, and branding the working people of Liverpool as "anti-British Communists."

The BNP blame migrant workers for falling wages. Yet it is British bosses who employ these workers, exploiting them to increase their profits. These are the same bosses the BNP look to for funding and support – the same bosses the BNP says it will defend if it ever comes to power. This is the 'free market' the BNP will never turn against.

The way to fight back is to unite workers, not to divide us as the BNP seeks to do. Division is exactly what the bosses want, allowing them to cut wages and working conditions. Striking oil refinery workers knew this and chased the BNP away from their protests. The unions in the Halewood car plants know this and every one of them has anti-racist and anti-BNP policies. Don't be fooled by BNP lies.
